AM SARAH THE JEW

In late 2010, I enlisted in the National Guard to continue my family's military heritage. I am the 4th generation and the first woman to serve in my family. After I left the National Guard in 2016, I was lost, and I still did not understand my place in this world. Struggling to find that place was nothing new to me. I came from an interfaith marriage, my mother is Jewish, and my father is Christian. It led to a lot of spiritual confusion for me growing up. We celebrated both Jewish and Christian holidays with both sides of the family, and certain aspects of Judaism permeated our home. I would attend church growing up, and I was always more interested in the Old Testament than the New. Eventually, it came to a point I stopped going to church and did not understand what faith I even believed in.

For several years, my veteran identity became the strongest identity I had, and it at times would prevent me from seeing all the other parts of myself. It took me moving to Texas to start my masters at Texas A&M University to finally become grounded in my Jewish faith. I had met a couple of Jews in town, and they recommended that I go to Chabad. It was not until I was physically brought to the doorstep on September 11th, 2020, by a very good friend to meet Manya and Rabbi Yossi that I understood that in my spiritual core, I was a Jew.

Since I started coming to Chabad, many things have changed. My perspective on life is more positive, and I am more grounded as a person. I got involved with Girls Dessert and Discussion, took a Sinai Scholars course, and began taking classes with Bais Chana. I am continuing to learn and grow as a proud Jewish Woman named after our matriarch Sarah. 1 am not Sarah the Christian; I am Sarah the Jew who served her country and will now move on to serve Hashem. I have a mezuzah on my door to show the world that a proud Jew lives there, and this is my home. - Sara Tolley, Graduate Student '21
